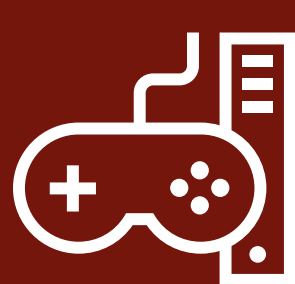




# Don't Play Games With Your Cybersecurity
